DIRECTIONS FOR USING THE

"SWAN SAFETY"

SCREW CAP FOUNTPEN, WITH "LADDER" FEED.

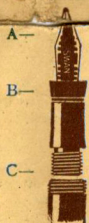

The "Swan" Safety Pen is so named because it has all the best "SWAN" features combined with a screw-on cap. This cap has an inner lip, the bevelled edges of which fit into a recess or slot in the nib section. The gold nib is not only protected by the cap, but it is kept in an air tight chamber which in conjunction with the new feed A, termed by us "ladder" feed on account of its comb like capillary slots, makes the pen absolutely ink tight and safe in any position. This simple fitting renders it impossible for the nib section B to be inked, through condensation. The air cannot expand inside the pen, and the new feed holds the ink against the nib just as it was left when writing ceased, so that the pen starts the moment it touches the paper.

The cap can only get filled through failure to screw on the cap firmly, or through misuse such as knocking the pen upside down on the table, a condition which never arises in the ordinary way.

Every pen is guaranteed perfect, and any fault promptly reported will be corrected or the pen exchanged free.



Unscrew at C.

nearly to the top with "SWAN" ink. Replace the section firmly, gently jar the ink to the point for the first time using and pen is ready.

If the new "Easy-Fill" Filler (recommended) is employed, the section is not unscrewed or pen taken apart in any way.

After writing, screw on the cap securely and firmly.

General Instructions. Use good ink, we make "SWAN" Ink specially for all fountain pens; your Stationer probably stocks it.

Don't mix inks.

Ink may flow too freely when pen is new—this will correct itself as soon as parts are thoroughly saturated—or when the reservoir is nearly empty. This should then be taken as a hint to refill.

DIRECTIONS FOR USING THE "SWAN SAFETY" PEN.

Never take a pen to pieces—especially don't remove nib or feeds.

Don't let the pen dry up by leaving it uncovered.

Should ink accidentally get into the cap, dry it out with a small roll of blotting paper.

Exchange. If the nib doesn't suit the hand, please send the complete pen for exchange, and state where and when it was purchased. We desire every pen to give satisfaction. Always send a sample steel nib.

When sending a pen for exchange or repair pack it carefully, and enclose a clear letter of instructions with 3d. stamps for return registered postage (in U.K.) If there should be any further charge, an advice will first be sent.

Repairs. All broken parts may be renewed. Half the price of the nib is allowed for an old one. Other parts are not allowed for, but new parts are reasonable in cost, and are supplied promptly. Pens for repair may be sent through your Stationer or direct to us. In the former case, insist on genuine "SWAN" parts being furnished.

Pocket Clips to protect Pens against loss.

Clips of various kinds from 1/- Nickel; 2/- gold plated or silver; 3/- 7/6 rolled gold, to 21/- in solid gold are supplied. Postage extra.

Leather pockets for One to Four Pens

At 6d., 1/-, 1/6, 2/-, 2/6 are sold for the same purpose. These have a secure safety pin for fastening inside the pocket or to a dress. Postage 1d. extra in U.K. unless ordered with other goods.

Ladies' pockets

Are specially designed and cost 2/- and 2/6 upwards. The 2/6 pattern is recommended, and has a patent spring hook for belt or skirt band. Postage 1d. extra in U.K. unless ordered with other goods.

"Swan" Ink.

It is important that good ink be used. "Swan" Ink is made specially for fountain pens from best blue gall nuts and does not thicken or clog in the pen. In bottles 6d. and 1/- with filler (Postage and Packing 5d. each extra in U.K.), also 2/- and 2/6 (no filler) (Postage and Packing 1/1 each extra in U.K.) Fountfillers for travellers, in wood case 1/-; nickel 1/6 (Postage 3d. extra in U.K.)

"Easy-Fill" Filler

Is a device containing "Swan" Ink for filling (at same time cleaning) any make of fountain pen without unscrewing, price 1/-, or in wood travelling case 1/6. (Postage and Packing 4d. each extra in U.K.)

Ink Tablets

Are useful to travellers. Small tube 6d.; Large 1/-, (postage 1d. extra in U.K. unless ordered with other goods). One is dropped in the holder which when filled with water combines to form ink, but such ink does not equal "SWAN" ink, and is recommended chiefly on account of convenience and portability. Use liquid "SWAN" ink when available.
